




The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health plan. The SBC shows you how you and the plan would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE: Information about the cost of this plan (called the premium) will be provided separately. Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall <u>deductible</u>?	For participating <u>providers</u> : \$1,750 person / \$3,500 family For non-participating <u>providers</u> : \$3,500 person / \$7,000 family	Generally, you must pay all of the costs from <u>providers</u> up to the <u>deductible</u> amount before this <u>plan</u> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the policy, the overall family <u>deductible</u> must be met before the <u>plan</u> begins to pay.
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u>?	Yes. For participating <u>providers</u> : <u>preventive care</u> is covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. For example, this <u>plan</u> covers certain <u>preventive services</u> without <u>cost-sharing</u> and before you meet your <u>deductible</u> . Are there other <u>deductibles</u> for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet <u>deductibles</u> for specific services.
What is the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> for this <u>plan</u>?	For participating providers: \$4,000 person / \$8,000 family (<u>deductible</u> & <u>coinsurance</u>) \$9,450 person / \$18,900 family (<u>deductible</u> , <u>coinsurance</u> & <u>prescription drug copays</u>) For non-participating providers: \$20,000 person / \$40,000 family (<u>deductible</u> & <u>coinsurance</u>)	The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <u>plan</u> , they have to meet their own <u>out-of-pocket limits</u> until the overall family <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> has been met.
What is not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u>?	<u>Premiums</u> , <u>balance billing</u> charges and health care this <u>plan</u> doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .
Will you pay less if you use a <u>network provider</u>?	Yes. See www.aetna.com/docfind/custom/mymeritain or call (800) 343-3140 for a list of <u>network providers</u> . Client pays 100% of Medicare for <u>out-of-network providers</u> . See your <u>plan</u> for more information.	This <u>plan</u> uses a <u>provider network</u> . You will pay less if you use a <u>provider</u> in the <u>plan's network</u> . You will pay the most if you use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> , and you might receive a bill from a <u>provider</u> for the difference between the <u>provider's</u> charge and what your <u>plan</u> pays (<u>balance billing</u>). Be aware, your <u>network provider</u> might use an <u>out-of-network provider</u> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <u>provider</u> before you get services.
Do you need a <u>referral</u> to see a <u>specialist</u>?	No.	You can see the <u>specialist</u> you choose without a <u>referral</u> .

Is a Health Savings Account (HSA) available under this <u>plan</u> option?	Yes.	An HSA is an account that may be set up by you or your employer to help you plan for current and future health care costs. You may make contributions to the HSA up to a maximum amount set by the IRS.
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 All **copayment** and **coinsurance** costs shown in this chart are after your **deductible** has been met, if a **deductible** applies.

About these Coverage Examples:



This is not a cost estimator. Treatments shown are just examples of how this plan might cover medical care. Your actual costs will be different depending on the actual care you receive, the prices your providers charge, and many other factors. Focus on the cost sharing amounts (deductibles, copayments and coinsurance) and excluded services under the plan. Use this information to compare the portion of costs you might pay under different health plans. Please note these coverage examples are based on self-only coverage.

Peg is Having a Baby
(9 months of in-network pre-natal care and a hospital delivery)

- The plan's overall deductible \$1,750
- Primary care physician coinsurance 10%
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 10%
- Other coinsurance 10%

Primary care physician visits (*prenatal care*)
 Childbirth/Delivery Professional Services
 Childbirth/Delivery Facility Services
 Diagnostic tests (*ultrasounds and blood work*)
 Specialist visit (*anesthesia*)

Managing Joe's Type 2 Diabetes
(a year of routine in-network care of a well-controlled condition)

- Specialist coinsurance 10%
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 10%
- Other coinsurance 10%

Specialist office visits (*including disease education*)
 Diagnostic tests (*blood work*)
 Prescription drugs
 Durable medical equipment (*glucose meter*)

Total Example Cost	\$5,600

Mia's Simple Fracture
(in-network emergency room visit and follow up care)

- The plan's overall deductible \$1,750
- Specialist coinsurance 10%
- Hospital (facility) coinsurance 10%
- Other coinsurance 10%

This **EXAMPLE** event includes services like:

Emergency room care (*including medical supplies*)
 Diagnostic test (*x-ray*)
 Durable medical equipment (*crutches*)
 Rehabilitation services (*physical therapy*)

Total Example Cost	\$2,800
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In this example, Mia would pay:

The total Mia would pay is	\$1,860
